

Pot Beetle Hunt at Loch Rannoch!

When: 7th and 8th July 2018 from 11am-4pm

<u>Meeting Place</u>: Parking area opposite Kinloch Rannoch post office, Loch Rannoch (South Road).

Pot beetles are a fascinating and charismatic group of leaf and petal-eating beetles that are very rare in Scotland!

This survey day is being organised to assess the status and remaining habitat for the rare **Ten-spotted pot beetle** (*Cryptocephalus decemmaculatus*), that is found in damp deciduous woodland at Loch Rannoch in beautiful Perthshire.
